On April 21, 2022, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed a certificate of concurrence and a tariff record¹ adopting by reference the non-conforming Large Generator Interconnection Agreement (LGIA) filed by Arizona Public Service Company (APS) among APS, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, Imperial Irrigation District, CAISO, and White Wing Ranch North, LLC.² CAISO requests an effective date of February 1, 2022, commensurate with the effective date of the LGIA. Pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation – West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307 (2021), the tariff record is accepted for filing, effective February 1, 2022, as requested.³

The filing was publicly noticed, with interventions and protests due on or before May 12, 2022. Pursuant to Rule 214 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2021)), notices of intervention, timely-filed motions to intervene, and any unopposed motions to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713 (2021).
