**Re: California Independent System Operator Corporation**

**Further Compliance Filing for Tariff Amendment Supporting  
Implementation of Day-Ahead Market Enhancements and  
Extended Day-Ahead Market Design**

**Docket No. ER26-1294-\_\_\_**

Dear Secretary Reese:

The California Independent System Operator Corporation (“CAISO”) submits this further filing in compliance with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission’s (“Commission”) Order Accepting Tariff Revisions issued on April 8, 2026 in the captioned docket.<sup>1</sup>

## **I. Background**

On February 6, 2026, the CAISO submitted a tariff amendment in this docket to clarify several areas of the CAISO tariff related to its Day-Ahead Market Enhancement (“DAME”) and Extended Day-Ahead Market (“EDAM”) designs. In the tariff amendment, the CAISO requested flexibility for its tariff revisions with an open-ended effective date of 12/31/9998 and referenced the potential effective date of May 1, 2026 in coordination with the potential effective date of the tariff revisions the Commission had accepted in the original docket to implement the DAME and EDAM initiatives (Docket No. ER23-2686), which the CAISO also expected to take effect on May 1, 2026.

In its April 8 Order, the Commission directed the CAISO to submit a compliance filing in the captioned docket through the eTariff system with the accepted tariff record text that establishes the actual effective date and designates the prior records accepted in the April 8 Order as OBE (overtaken by events).<sup>2</sup> The CAISO submitted the required compliance filing on April 24, 2026 (“April 24 Compliance Filing”) and requested that the Commission accept the tariff records contained therein effective May 1, 2026.

## II. Further Compliance Filing

This further compliance filing is intended to ensure that the Commission’s eTariff page for the CAISO correctly reflects that the language contained in the tariff record versions from the April 24 Compliance Filing are the latest, currently effective versions as of May 1, 2026. In order to produce that result, the Record Effective Priority Order values of those tariff record versions must be higher than the Record Effective Priority Order values of all previously accepted tariff record versions with that effective date from the initial DAME-EDAM tariff amendment filed on August 22, 2023 in Docket ER23-2686, and higher than the Priority Order values of any subsequent versions of those tariff records with that effective date. When multiple pending or accepted versions of a tariff record have the same effective date, the Record Effective Priority Order value of each version serves as a “tie-breaker” in determining which version takes effect on that date. The version with the highest Record Effective Priority Value is the effective one; all other versions with the same proposed effective date are shown on the Commission’s eTariff page as OBE or superseded.

Pursuant to the instructions in the Commission orders accepting, as of the actual DAME-EDAM implementation date, the tariff record versions initially submitted in the above-captioned docket,<sup>3</sup> the tariff record versions submitted in the April 24 Compliance Filing had Record Effective Priority Values sufficient to ensure that the previously submitted tariff record versions in that docket were superseded by the compliance filing versions. However, due to an administrative oversight on the CAISO’s part, the Record Effective Priority Values of the April 24 Compliance Filing tariff record versions would not be high enough to supersede the original DAME-EDAM tariff record versions filed in Docket ER23-2686, once the proposed effective date on those Docket No. ER23-2686 versions was changed, from the placeholder date (12/31/9998) that the Commission’s eTariff system uses to represent an open-ended effective date, to May 1, 2026, as the CAISO requested in its informational filing in Docket ER23-2686, also submitted on April 24, 2026.

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The CAISO is making this filing with new versions of all of the tariff records from the April 24 Compliance Filing. The tariff language contained in these tariff record versions is identical to that in the April 24 Compliance Filing tariff record versions. The sole difference is that these tariff record versions have Record Effective Priority Order values high enough to supersede all previous versions with a May 1, 2026 effective date. This will enable Commission Staff to adjust the open-ended effective dates of all the Docket ER23-2686 tariff record versions to May 1, 2026, as the CAISO has requested, without any concern that those versions might then supersede the April 24 Compliance Filing. Since this filing does not change the tariff language from that submitted in the April 24 Compliance Filing, the clean tariff language attachment from the April 24 Compliance Filing is not being resubmitted herein.

### **III. Conclusion**

The CAISO requests that the Commission accept this further compliance filing effective May 1, 2026.
