Goals of Today's Focus Group

The Focus Group structure is meant to embrace flexibility to allow organic and robust conversation on a specific topic with the goal of driving towards a solution collaboratively.

- 1. Review stakeholder feedback themes from the May 5 Focus Group session**
- 2. Discuss alternative proposal to address testing requirements for AS certified fleet**

Background and Issue Identification

- Under Tariff Section 8.10, the ISO shall periodically conduct announced tests of resources providing Ancillary Services.
 - The frequency of testing shall be within such time frames as are reasonable under all the circumstances.

Problem Statement: Under current available market mechanisms, the ISO faces challenges ensuring testing of 100% of its resources certified to provide Ancillary Services within such time frames as are reasonable under all the circumstances. This has led to a need to evaluate ***additional*** ways to validate that AS resources can appropriately respond to and provide their certified AS amounts.

Feedback Themes from Focus Group #2

- The added value of signing the attestation is unclear, and the risks may outweigh the benefits.
- Proposed changes should be made through a formal stakeholder or Business Practice Manual (BPM) process.
- Additional training on current resource performance and Ancillary Services expectations is preferred over requiring attestations.
- Resource performance testing should be conducted by CAISO to ensure reliability, not shifted to Scheduling Coordinators and Resource Owners.
- Concerns exist about excessive costs for re-testing.
- More clarity is needed on repercussions for non-compliance or failure to submit the attestation.

Alternative Proposal

- The ISO will continue conducting Ancillary Services testing and performance audits under Tariff Sections 8.9 and 8.10.
- Amend the Compliance Monitoring and Market Operations BPMs through Proposed Revision Requests (PRRs) expanding on the scope of the ISO's ancillary services testing program. The ISO intends to update Operating Procedure 5370 to reflect these BPM revisions.
 - Goals:
 1. Increase transparency of the frequency and performance of ancillary services tests
 2. Clarify the ISO's expectations that all Ancillary Service Providers shall check, monitor and/or test their system and related equipment routinely to assure availability of the committed Ancillary Services as required in Tariff Section 8.9.
- The ISO may initiate a data request as necessary to verify how the resource owner is checking, monitoring, and/or testing their system and related equipment as required in Tariff Section 8.9 if:
 1. The ISO is unable to test the resource within a specific timeframe
 2. The ISO has concerns with a resource's ability to provide Ancillary Services and is unable to verify through means listed in the Market Operations and Compliance Monitoring BPMs.

Current Testing Frequency

- Frequency
 - RTCD Performance audits are conducted following every RTCD
 - Monthly Regulation Audits are conducted for all resources having a minimum of five (5) qualifying intervals in the month being audited.
 - Unannounced AS Compliance tests
 - Under normal conditions the following conditions will result in a resource being placed on the list for the applicable product.
 - Certification for the first time or completion of a recertification test
 - Failure of a performance audit or performance verification
 - Lack of valid passing performance audit or performance verification within two (2) years

Proposed Language

- If at the end of three (3) years, CAISO is unable to test using the above methodologies, CAISO will evaluate the need for a data request based on current operational performance and ongoing outages.
- This data request will be to verify how the resource owner is checking, monitoring, and/or testing their system and related equipment as required in Tariff Section 8.9. At any time the SC may request a re-certification test to verify capabilities.
