Goals of Today's Focus Group

Background and Issue Identification

- Under Tariff Section 8.10, the ISO shall periodically conduct announced tests of resources providing Ancillary Services.
 - The frequency of testing shall be within such time frames as are reasonable under all the circumstances.

<u>Problem Statement</u>: Under current available market mechanisms, the ISO faces challenges ensuring testing of 100% of its resources certified to provide Ancillary Services within such time frames as are reasonable under all the circumstances. This has led to a need to evaluate alternative ways to validate that AS resources can appropriately respond to and provide their certified AS amounts.

Feedback Themes from Focus Group #1

- Clarity requested surrounding the penalties and consequences surrounding non-performance under an attestation
- Clarity requested on whether the attestation requirement would inform or impact the frequency of AS testing and/or performance audits
- Attestations should be signed by the resource owner as opposed to the scheduling coordinator

Revised Proposal:

ENSURING 100% OF CERTIFIED A/S FLEET HAS VALIDATED THE ABILITY TO RESPOND



Proposal for ensuring validation of A/S response

<u>Problem Statement</u>: Under current available market mechanisms, the ISO faces challenges ensuring testing of 100% of its resources certified to provide Ancillary Services within such time frames as are reasonable under all the circumstances. This has led to a need to evaluate alternative ways to validate that AS resources can appropriately respond to and provide their certified AS amounts.

Proposed solution:

- Within 60 days upon notification from CAISO, the scheduling coordinator (SC) must submit to CAISO an attestation signed by the Resource Owner on the resource's ability to provide AS services.
 - Failure to submit the signed attestation within 60 days of receiving the notification may result in suspension or revocation of the resource's A/S certification.
 - Resources subject to the revocation of A/S certification will need to go through the re-certification process.
