
Targeted Audience: Market participants who use Customer Market Results Interface (CMRI) to view reports to view and download private market information resulting from the ISO and EIM market processes.

Details:

The California ISO is implementing a technology update for our user interface (UI) software and API webservices framework (i.e. JAVA) in the Production environment. Participants will notice a few changes to the UI look and feel. The new version may move familiar items around slightly, change the look of some elements, or anchor UI elements in a different order. Note: There are no core functionality changes to the CMRI application.

Below are some notable changes for CMRI:

Order of the Header Icons	 Stop Loading icon is before the Refresh icon	 Stop Loading icon is after the Refresh Icon
Display Grid: Export Icon	 Import Icon not displayed without any data on the output grid	 Import icon displayed even though when data is not loaded/available and it is disabled.
Application Footer details	 Footer displayed with logged in user details and environment name with a dot separator.	 Footer displayed with Versioning and Build Time Stamp With pipe symbol separator along with logged in user details and environment name.

Possible Internet Explorer (IE) Compatibility issues

Should you encounter issues with the CMRI UI or API after the technology update and are using Microsoft Edge as your internet browser, please coordinate with your Information Technology (IT) personnel to disable your Internet Explorer (IE) Compatibility Mode. The recent update requires MS Edge to not have Internet Explorer (IE) 11 compatibility enabled on their browser. If you are using CHROME, no action is needed.
