Enhancements to the CRR Model to Mitigate Diminution of Long-Term CRRs

Azusa has been informed by CAISO that revisions to the CRR model have resulted in the loss of long-term CRR rights for Azusa. Preservation of awarded long-term CRRs should be a priority to support long-term resource procurement. Azusa requests that the ISO consider enhancements to the CRR model to avoid diminution of long-term CRRs as a result of other changes to the model.

Please provide any data/information available that would characterize the importance or magnitude of the issue.

As described above, stability of long-term CRR awards is essential to support long-term procurement of resources by LSEs. Long-term resource procurement enhances reliability by providing greater stability for the ISO's fleet of available resources. Design enhancements to mitigate diminution of long-term CRR awards therefore will promote grid reliability.

Analysis of Costs and Benefits of the Energy Imbalance Market

The Six Cities recommend that CAISO initiate a comprehensive analysis, in as much detail as possible, of the costs and benefits of the Energy Imbalance Market ("EIM"), including an evaluation of the load-weighted distribution of benefits in comparison to allocation or assignment of responsibility for EIM costs.

Please provide any data/information available that would characterize the importance or magnitude of the issue.

A more comprehensive and detailed analysis of EIM costs and benefits is necessary to evaluate whether the EIM market design is as consistent as possible with the cost causation principle. From time to time CAISO has considered potential modification of elements of the EIM design, but such consideration has tended to focus on one or more design elements in isolation. A comprehensive analysis of EIM costs, allocation of responsibility for those costs, and load-weighted distribution of benefits is necessary to support informed consideration of the reasonableness of any potential modifications to the EIM design. The proposed analysis is critical to the on-going development of a just, reasonable, and efficient EIM.
